### Sevenside Recycling Awards

JWS attended the Sevenside Achievement in Recycling Awards 2010 on 13 May as a shortlisted winner for The Landfill Diversion Technology Award.



Reduce, Reuse, Recycle is the mantra for Sevenside and they believe if we are to move forward in our goal of maximum diversion from landfill then special attention has to be given to waste arisings that cannot easily be recycled. These could be streams directly not suitable for recycling, or materials that are contaminated to such a degree that recycling is not a realistic option. The award sought to recognise Sevenside's business partners who had significantly contributed to the landfill alternatives available to them and as a result of a proportion of our waste being made into a Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF); this is what helped us achieve the award in conjunction with Orchid Environmental. We direct all of Tesco stores waste across the North West away from landfill and into energy recovery.

### Manchester United Football Club

We have donated 3 tickets on behalf of our customer Eric Wright Construction for an MUFC home game next season for a charity event at Leigh Primary School, soon to be named Sacred Heart, the funds are in aid of the school itself.



We recently sponsored the Reds Go Green campaign for Manchester United Football Club. We helped to organise internal recycling for their canteen and offices.

One of our trade waste vehicles has made several appearances on the famous Weatherfield set on Coronation Street. Unfortunately we can't keep our logos visible so they've changed the business name to Weatherfield Waste Solutions, but we do actually help Granada TV recycle their waste.
